- Sweden to innovations such as Bluetooth, Skype and Spotify and its capital Stockholm is currently producing the highest number of so-called 'unicorns' (or billion-dollar tech companies) per capita after Silicon Valley.
- Finland has given birth to the world's best (and free) education system, fostering innovation then and now
- Denmark with innovations in the food, agriculture and processing sector lead by companies like Arla Foods/Dano.

Nigeria is gradually emerging as a hotbed of innovations cutting across the financial services, agriculture, hospitality and entertainment. 



Nigeria aims to transform from being a petroleum-products-import dependent country into one that is fully selfsufficient in local refining and a net exporter of petroleum products. Nigerian National Petroleum Corporation (NNPC) is currently supporting several projects driven by private capital in Upstream, Refining, Gas, Power and Renewable Energy. The country wants to generate 30% of its electricity via renewable sources by 2020.


